



DOG LICENSE APPLICATION

Per Star City Code 4-4-6, any person within the City of Star who owns, harbors, keeps, or possesses a dog which is older than six months of age must procure a license for said dog(s). Written proof of spay or neuter and proof of current rabies vaccination, issued by a licensed veterinarian, must accompany this application. All licenses are valid until December 31st of each calendar year.

The City of Star does not presently employ dedicated animal control personnel. Reports of loose dogs are called in to the Ada County Sheriff's Office non-emergency dispatch. They assign an officer to pick up the dog and take them to Star Veterinary until such time that the owner can be located. Your dog license helps protect your dog via means of the ID tag, and your fee helps defray the costs of the veterinary office that takes the animals in.
