2024 HIGHLIGHTS

In October 2024, Mayor Chadwick and Star City Council added an Admin. Sergeant, K9 Deputy, and summer Juvenile Detective to Star PD. We are extremely grateful for their unwavering support in providing these positions to keep Star safe.

- ➤ The Admin. Sergeant will supervise the Problem Oriented Police Team [who focus on traffic enforcement, community engagement/ education, and problem areas in Star] and three Detectives. They will also oversee Star PD grants or community engagement efforts, assist with supervision of daily operations, and help organize trainings between Star PD and Star Fire.
- The K9 Deputy is a first for Star PD and will be a force multiplier for patrol work. This extra help is expected to remove more narcotics from Star's streets, reduce response times, and provide extra deputy availability to help keep Star a safe place to live, work, and play.
- The summer Juvenile Detective will assist on summertime juvenile crimes. Last year, juvenile issues increased at some of Star's great amenities, such as the swimming pond at Freedom Park. This additional position will help Star PD monitor juvenile issues and provide extra support to deter such activity.

We are excited about the additional positions in Star. We love this City and look forward to a great year!

MESSAGE FROM POLICE CHIEF HESSING


I want to extend my deepest gratitude to each of you for your continued support and collaboration in making our community a safer place to live, work, and play. In 2024, we continued to see an increasing number of residents choosing Star as their home and have witnessed new opportunities and challenges. With 2.25 new positions, Star PD now staffs 20.25 commissioned deputies (10 Patrol Deputies; 3 Problem Oriented Police Deputies; 3.25 Detectives; 2 Patrol Sergeants; 1 Administrative Sergeant; 1 Chief of Police) and 1 professional Administrative Assistant. This staffing aligns with Star's goal of having 1 deputy per 1,000 residents.

We are committed to meeting our residents' needs by expanding our community policing efforts, investing in new technologies, and enhancing community outreach. For this, we asked BSU to do a community survey and I am happy to see that 91.1% of Star respondents "felt that their local law enforcement treats citizens fairly and with respect and take the time to listen to people". We also found that the 3 areas of concerns for Ada County residents were: (1) increased police presence and traffic enforcement to reduce speeding and increase a sense of safety; (2) specific strategies targeting areas perceived as having higher rates of crime; and (3) increased publication of data on traffic stops, accidents, crimes, and incidents (see the 3 QR codes in the bottom left corner of this page).

Star PD will remain focused on maintaining proactive policing strategies that emphasize prevention, education, and engagement. We are fully committed to maintaining the high standards of service, accountability, and transparency that you expect from your police department. We are proud to serve such a vibrant, expanding community, and together, we will continue to help elevate the lives of all our community members. Thank You!


CRIME AND CLEARANCE
